Minutes of the Arkansas-Boston Mountain NRHS Meeting

May 15, 2008

The regular scheduled meeting of the Arkansas-Boston Mountain Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on May 15, 2008 by President Gary McCullah, at the residence of Bob Stark in Fayetteville, AR. There were 27 members and 1 guest present.

Secretary, Clare McCullah's minutes from the April 2008 meeting were approved as stated in the *Scrambler* dated May 2008.
